Who Should Attend

This qualification is suitable for all those who come into contact with Vulnerable Adults (staff or Volunteers).

Learning Outcomes

By the end of this course delegates should be able to:

- Recognise truths and myths surrounding abuse
- Describe what constitutes abuse & identify the indicators
- Recognise signs and symptoms
- Identify appropriate action if a client/patient discloses he/she has been abused
- Identify appropriate action if concerned about the behaviour of another member of staff or colleague
- Identify appropriate action if concerned about the behaviour of a family member/carer

Course Content

Delegates will receive training in the following subjects:

- Statistics of abuse
- Defining abuse and categories of abuse
- Patterns and causes of abuse
- Signs and symptoms of abuse
- Conduct during disclosures

Course Duration

The course is ½ day in duration (3 hours + exam)

Assessment Method & Certification

The assessment will be by the completion of a multiple choice question examination at the end of the course. On successful completion of the course, delegates will receive a certificate of competence, which is valid for 3 years.
